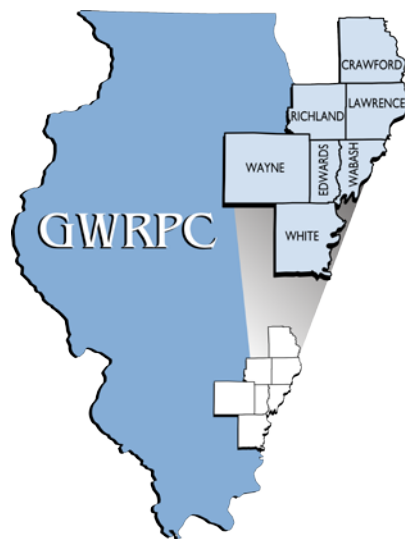

Greater Wabash Regional Planning Commission Mission Statement

The Commission serves the Greater Wabash District by providing local, regional, and comprehensive planning, facilitating knowledge enhancement, securing and administering funds and promoting cooperative solutions to regional issues.

Background

The Greater Wabash Regional Planning Commission's Economic Development District consists of the following seven counties: Crawford, Edwards, Lawrence, Richland, Wabash, Wayne, and White. The office of the Commission is located at 10 West Main Street, P.O. Box 209, Albion, IL 62806.

Regional Planning Commissions are voluntary multi-service entities formed under Illinois law by counties, municipalities and towns to serve local government planning needs. Greater Wabash Regional Planning Commission (GWRPC) was officially established by the Edwards, Wabash and White County boards. Wayne County was annexed into the Commission in 1971, Lawrence County was added in October 1998, Richland County in December 1998, and Crawford County in 2001.

There are currently 14 multi-county regional councils and about the same number of single-county councils in Illinois having at least one full-time staff person. Regional Planning Commissions were established under Chapter 55 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes.

Affiliations

Greater Wabash Regional Planning Commission is a federally designated Economic Development District by the United States Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration. GWRPC also serves as the Local Development District for Delta Regional Authority which includes White County.

GWRPC is a member of the Illinois Association of Regional Councils, ILARC. ILARC serves as the recognized organization representing regional councils at the state level.

GWRPC is a member of saIL, Southeastern Alliance of Illinois, a regional marketing group that includes the counties of: Crawford, Lawrence, Richland, Wabash and White.

GWRPC has been working with the Economic Development initiative ConnectSI since the summer of 2006. In 2010, the Executive Director was appointed to the Connect SI Foundation Board of Directors.

2014-2015 Grant Summary

- GWRPC submitted grant applications in 2014-2015 totaling \$4,885,398 with a cumulative total project cost of \$8,543,568.
- **\$1,548,798** of grants that were submitted by GWRPC were funded in 2014-2015.

2014 Year in Review



In 2013, The US EPA selected the *Greater Wabash Regional Planning Commission* for two brownfields assessment grants totaling \$400,000. The EPA Community-wide hazardous substances and petroleum grant funds will be used to conduct approximately ten (10) Phase I and six (6) Phase II environmental site assessments throughout the GWRPC seven county region. Grants funds also will be used to develop cleanup plans and support community outreach activities. The project will allow the region to get several sites ready for economic development or other redevelopment uses such as green space.



GWRPC is a Local Development District for the Delta Regional Authority. The Local Development District consists of White County. In the capacity of LDD, the planning commission prepares and distributes information on the Delta Regional Authority as well as prepares and submits DRA grants on a yearly basis.

In 2013, the Executive Director was appointed by Delta Regional Authority Federal Co-Chairman Chris Masingill to represent the State of Illinois in the Federal Delta Leadership Institute (DLI). The Delta Leadership Institute organizes the Delta Leadership Institute Executive Academy, a year-long leadership development program for regional leaders that prepares them to collaborate and address the most pressing issues of the Delta region. Director Mann graduated in September and will remain an alumni of the Delta Leadership Network and represent the State of Illinois and the GWRPC region. The Delta Leadership Network comprises all alumni of the Executive Academy and is tasked in maintaining these relationships between regional leaders so as to foster collaboration and coalition building in addressing the Delta's most pressing issues.

In 2014, GWRPC worked with the other regional planning commissions throughout Southern Illinois and Illinois DCEO to put together a fracking workshop to discuss up and coming changes in the Oil Industry. GWRPC will continue this work in 2015.

GWRPC represents the region as a member of Illinois Association of Regional Councils, ILARC. ILARC is a non-profit, non-partisan association that promotes and defends the interests and activities of regional councils. GWRPC once again partnered with ILARC and the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to provide technical assistance in our region for Energy Now grants.

For the third consecutive year, GWRPC was contracted by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity and Illinois Association of County Board Members to provide grant writing services to the region for Illinois Energy Now Energy Rebates. The rebates are for all public entities, schools and colleges to get electric or gas rebates on lighting, HVAC, motors and kitchen electrics.

The Planning Commission continues to serve as a contact for local and national statistical information.

GWRPC has an U.S. Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration (EDA) funded Revolving Loan Fund available to businesses within the seven county district. In 2013-2014, GWRPC provided Revolving Loan Fund services to 14 businesses in the district.

GWRPC's Executive Director serves on the Connect SI Foundation Board of Directors. Connect SI is a 20 county initiative in Southern Illinois which provides collaborative solutions to broadband Internet access, advancement of regional health care services and connectivity solutions, research and GIS mapping services, and the Lead SI youth leadership initiative. *The mission of Connect SI Foundation is to connect assets throughout the region to advance southernmost Illinois.* Connect SI includes the Greater Wabash counties of Edwards, Wabash, Wayne and White.

GWRPC has been working with U of I Extension on a Stronger Economies Together, SET, region project funded by USDA/RD. The region includes the GWRPC County of White. Stronger Economies Together (SET) represents an exciting initiative launched in 2009 by USDA Rural Development in collaboration with the four Regional Rural Development Centers (RRDCs) and their land-grant university partners, including especially the Purdue Center for Regional Development. The purpose of SET is to strengthen the capacity of communities/counties in rural America to work together in developing and implementing an economic development blueprint that strategically builds on the current and emerging economic strengths of their region. The SET process has occurred or is occurring in 28 states across the U.S. U of I has expressed their intent to apply for the other 6 counties of the GWRPC region in the next SET round which is this year.

GWRPC has been working very closely with neighboring planning commissions on the issue of Hydraulic Fracturing in the region. A Fracking Working Group was set up which includes planning commissions, Illinois DCEO, private industry, Illinois Oil and Gas and Economic Development Directors. GWRPC has been attending regular meetings to discuss this potential economic development activity in the region.



In addition to grant writing and administrative services, GWRPC has provided the seven- county region with many non-monetary services. The most important service that GWRPC offers the district is the fact that they continue to represent the seven county district with the United States Department of Commerce: Economic Development Administration as the official Economic Development District. GWRPC is responsible for writing and maintaining the District's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS). As the District Organization, we appoint and facilitate a CEDS Committee that will help to develop this document.
